ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF VOTER ID IN TEXAS

To register in Texas you must:
- be a citizen of the United States
- be a resident of the county of application for registration
- be at least 17 yrs and 10 mos old
- not be finally convicted of a felony, or if a convicted felon, - have fully discharged your punishment, including any incarceration, parole, supervision, period of probation, or be pardoned
- have not been declared mentally incompetent by final judgment of a court of law

MAKE A VOTING PLAN

When will you vote?

Plan around work, events, etc. Bring kids! Remember, state law allows you to take paid time off for voting on election days, if you don't have two consecutive hours to vote outside of working hours.

Where will you vote?

Check your polling place options. Remember, if voting in Travis County, you may vote at any location; pick a convenient one!

How will you transport yourself to your voting location?

Do you have a car? Will you use public transit? Do you need a ride to the polls? Remember, you can arrange on in Austin via techvotes.org/ride.

Are you prepared to vote?

Are you registered? Do you have ID?
